Towards achieving its stated mission, Plustrust has institutionalised a multi-dimensional

approach, whereby it offers micro-incubation support through Fellowship opportunities for Rural Women Changemakers who wish to implement ideas that could make a difference in their respective communities across key themes like Inclusive Education, Community Health, Skills and Livelihoods, along with relevant training and mentorship interventions. Integrated into this methodology is the pursuit of empowerment and sustainability by helping these change agents evolve into self reliant regional hubs.

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS

We are happy to report that the last twelve months have seen significant progress both qualitative and quantitative, with appreciable developments in the design as well as spread of our programs. With addition of Jharkhand our footprint now spans 7 states, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh and Jharkhand.

Further, our efforts at mentoring and upskilling our cohort of fellows has helped us create self reliant hubs in Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh.

Our Anchor network has grown, to a total of 19 with 7 new additions.

With the help of this expanding anchor network, we conducted nine Workshops to reach 241 potential women changemakers.

We offered 60 fellowships from September 2022 to August 2023 comprising 26 Rural women Edupreneur Fellowship, 13 Return to Roots Fellowships and 21 Community Health Entrepreneur Fellowships (compared to 52 fellowships offered from September 2021 to August 2022).

Through our work, we improved the quality of education for 2500 children, offered better healthcare for more than 1000 rural households and ensured a minimum of 20% increase in income for all 60 fellows.



NEW INITIATIVES

JANSEHAT - THE COMPREHENSIVE CHE MODEL

Plustrust partnered with Spotsense and Stepone to develop the CHE model comprehensive by integrating rapid testing communicable and seasonal diseases and teleconsultation support. With the basic CHE program piloted last year, each CHE was able to do 7 basic tests. Thanks to JanSehat Program, they are trained to do 16 tests including height, weight, SpO2, Temperature, Hemoglobin count, Blood sugar, Blood Pressure, Malaria, Thyroid, Typhoid, Dengue, Syphilis, Blood Group and Urine. Spotsense has brought to us their cost portable rapid testing devices and trained the team and CHEs of the second batch.

With the support and guidance of renowned doctors from the Stepone network, CHEs are now recording comprehensive patient information and arranging teleconsultations. We completed over a 100 teleconsultations within the first month and see this collaboration as a new pathway to offer the comprehensive medical support for patients in remote locations.

STREEVIKAS FELLOWSHIPS

Fair Trade Forum India (FTFI) invited Plustrust to design and manage the inaugural cohort of the StreeVikas Fellowships for emerging women leaders in the craft sector. Through this initiative, FTFI seeks to build and deepen the leadership pipeline for the fair-trade craft sector using a long-term multi-dimensional approach. For Plustrust it is a unique opportunity to embed our approach to build rural women changemakers in a significant network.

DIGISHALA

Plustrust invited People's Awareness Network Society (PANS), to take up a pilot project "DigiShala" for training in digital marketing, tailored for us. Launched in June 2023, Digishala has offered training on creating visuals for products and services, using social media platforms to share awareness about their work, improve storytelling skills to reach out to more audience and to use all the tools available for better outreach and marketing.

Initially 18 women participated in this program and 16 completed the course. They are now actively promoting their work on social media and getting more impressions on their work.

This is in response to the interest evinced by Fellows and Alumni in digital marketing.

ORIENTATION WORKSHOPS

With the agenda of discovering and encouraging rural women change makers in resource poor geographies we conducted a total of **9 workshops** from Sep 22 to Aug 23 (compared to 6 Workshop Last year between Sep 21 to Aug 22). **241 women** participated from Bihar, Rajasthan, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, UttarPradesh, Uttarakhand and Jharkhand.

FELLOWSHIPS

We have offered fellowships to 60 women and girls from rural locations mainly in Central India. State wise we now have 17 fellows from Madhya Pradesh, 12 form Bihar, 15 from Uttar Pradesh, 5 from Rajasthan, 7 from Maharashtra and 4 from Jharkhand.

MADHYA PRADESH

In Madhya Pradesh 8 RWE fellows are working with communities living around Sarhi gate of the famous Kanha national park. Some of them work with the Baiga community to provide children first a hand experience of school education.

In another exciting initiative, five young women have set to become drivers of jeeps taking visitors on forest safari. They are learning to drive LMVs will soon get their driving license and begin driving vehicles in association with local resorts. This will surely shake up some stereotypes about women drivers!

These fellows are being mentored by Plustrust anchors Deepak, Anand Tandiya and Birajo Sonwani under the overall guidance of the Nagda Hub.



In addition we have our CHE fellowships in Madhya Pradesh, with 4 additions this year under JanSehat Program. They have learnt the basic tests and are now learning about rapid testing devices and teleconsultation.

UTTAR PRADESH

This year we offered 8 RTR and 7 RWE fellowships in Uttar Pradesh.

RTR fellows are trying out new ideas and working on skill development for women from the local community. Besides sewing, they are experimenting with organic fertilizer and pesticides, seed preservation and weaving upcycled rugs from old clothes.

RWE Fellows are working with the children from the local community to increase their participation in school. Importantly, they work to create awareness among the parents about their child's education.

12 CHE fellowships are given this year from different blocks of Muzaffarpur district (Bandra, Marwan, Mushari, Aurai) and Patna. Once they are ready they will begin door to door testing and online consultation for the community. They will then be introduced to the rapid testing devices.

MAHARASHTRA

This year we have 7 RWE fellows in Maharashtra being mentored by our anchor Shaila Yadav. Majusha and Ashwini work with the local communities in Satara, encouraging the parents to send children to school and teaching the students in a fun way so that they can enjoy learning. Swati and Shrutika provide skill building education to the local women. Vaishnavi, Kalyani and Mayuri are creating awareness about preservation of indigenous trees, collecting seeds and even started a conservation center within community.



RAJASTHAN

This year we have 5 additional CHEs under the JanSehat program. They are working in rural areas of Udaipur and Banswara, providing door to door testing and teleconsultation facilities to the local community.



JHARKHAND

As we continue our journey to reach new geographies, we have now made an entry in Jharkhand. Our workshop in august 2023, with 23 women has brought in 1 RTR and 3 RWE Fellowships.



ANCHOR DEVELOPMENT

Anchor development is crucial for our growth and is an immersive process. We have been able to find and induct several new anchors in this year, giving us hope and ambitions for the future.

Radheshyam Chauhan

Radheshyam is a post-graduate in social work and organizes communities to improve in livelihoods and incomes. He has formed and empowered 40+ Self help women groups in more than 11 villages in the Nagda region. He has worked at Kripa Welfare Trust as a Program Manager for the last 11 years. . He is eager to try the individual oriented fellowship model to encourage women with aspirations in the community. He is now mentoring 6 Plustrust fellows in the Nagda region

Balmukund hails from Devli, a small village in Ujjain district and has been a guest teacher in a govt school for around 10 years. He himself belongs to a humble background and has struggled to gain quality education. He got in touch with Mera Gaon Meri Duniya and expressed his wish of bringing a larger impact in the area of education. He supports 3 new fellows who wish to innovate around the idea of equity in education in the Nagda region of Madhya Pradesh.

Deepak Yadav

Deepak owns and runs a homestay near Sarahi gate of Kanha Tiger Reserve in Mandla District of MP. Being from the local area, he is keen to develop sustainable livelihoods for local youth. Since there is a rush of tourists during the Safari period, he sees many opportunities to support women of his region to earn a dignified living through skill building. He is now working with a group of 5 women who are learning to drive. He envisions them riding Safari jeeps someday in the forest accompanying tourists



Birajo Sonmani



Birajo belongs to a small village in the buffer zone of Kanha Tiger Reserve. She has been a grassroot field worker and educator at Aide et Action. She is concerned that the children of the Baiga community do not have access to quality education. She started her work as a Plustrust fellow and runs a learning center in her village teaching around 40 children regularly. Her sincerity, dedication, skills and the will to bring about a larger change are truly inspiring. She now anchors 3 more fellows to improve the quality of education in the area.

Shailesh Singh

Shailesh belongs to Risia block in Bahraich, Uttar Pradesh. She worked with Tata Trust on the Women's Literacy Program. When the Women's Literacy Program ended, Shailesh founded SARJU FOUNDATION, where she worked on social issues such as education, child labor, menstrual health, child marriage prevention and livelihoods. established a sewing center, which later training center. became а She is currently mentoring 5 Plustrust fellows.

HUBS

We moved closer towards functional autonomy for hubs with our on ground partner MGMD taking full responsibility for offering RWE and R2R fellowships around Nagda and Sarhi (MP), M P. Currently the cost is met by Plustrust and in due course we expect that the hub will become self reliant.

The Udaipur hub continues to cover all the other states. We now have a full time Hub coordinator in each location and their work is supervised by Managers

ALUMNI ENGAGEMENT

Our alumni continue to inspire us with their dedication and grit. Of the 45 women who began their fellowships between September 2021 and August 2022, we are proud to share that 23 have continued their work in their community and 2 have taken up jobs aligned to their interest and purpose. In response to the interest shown by alumni, we have initiated the Digishala program.



Ashwin Patil from Bangalore and Ruby Calcuttawala made the effort to travel to Sarhi and worked with the Mandla Alumni , helping them deepen their awareness about teaching methods. This in turn was an opportunity for them to explore ways to improve their incomes.





We continue to look to our alumni to build our own team and our network and take this moment to celebrate our journey together beyond the fellowship period.

UPDATES

SoCC for Transformative Learning

The Social Capital Credit (SoCCs) model has been transformative, increasing parental involvement from 3% to 96.95% in Sparsh education centers. Parents completed five community initiatives, enhancing education quality. They were also trained to support home-based learning. Academic improvements are evident, with 65.19% of students now reading in Hindi (from 17%), while math proficiency grew significantly. Over 500 children and 10 youth benefited, and 10 schools received vital resources. The community supported eight schools in painting projects. SoCCs have truly empowered the community and improved education outcomes. The project is led by Nagesh Panchal and Vasudha Kapoor.

Maker Spaces in Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBV)

Plustrust was awarded a grant by Rise Up and The Emerging Markets Foundation ("EMpower") to set up "Maker spaces" in government residential schools (KGBVs) for disadvantaged girls in July 2022. The project was spearheaded by Ashwani Tiwari. The establishment of four Maker Labs within KGBVs has had a profound impact on the learning experiences of 400 girls. They have become vibrant hubs of hands-on learning, fostering skills in areas such as electrical engineering, electronics, digital literacy, robotics, computing, and coding. Through the 180-hour Maker Mindset course, these young learners gained technical knowledge and developed crucial problem-solving and leadership skills. Their achievements have been remarkable, with 30 of the girls successfully creating functional prototypes, demonstrating their innovative prowess.







Teacher Leadership Program

We continue our association with Parashuram Public School and have offered scholarships to 21 students, with mentoring from our Nagda team when required.

Samvaad- A Micro-funding Platform

During the reporting period, we successfully completed another round of Samvaad. This round involved the participation of five Changemakers from Plustrust's fellowship network. To support these Changemakers, three Curators provided guidance and coaching over a span of two weeks. As a result, four Donors selected three of these Changemakers for further dialogue, committing to a total of INR 1.95 Lakhs in support for four Changemakers.

Currently, we are actively exploring opportunities for collaboration with other fundraising platforms that share our enthusiasm for assisting grassroots NGOs in their early stages of development.

ORGANIZATION DEVELOPMENT

With the growing complexity in our work, we sought ways to strengthen internal systems and processes and build our team. We were fortunate to find two opportunities in the past few months to help us.

We signed up for the Pravah's Saansthaa Cohort (March to September 23) and this helped us build our shared vision and improve goal setting, role clarity, feedback, reporting and review systems for greater impact.
